General Description of Type of Tasks Performed: Detoxification services are administered in a 20 bed adult co-ed residential medically monitored unit. Services are provided to the chemical dependent individual in need of medically monitored withdrawal from alcohol and other drugs. Other services include chemical dependency education, orientation to 12 step programs, case management, and continuing care counseling and discharge planning. The course of client's treatment, following ASAM Placement, is determined by individual needs gathered from the biopsychosocial, and other collaborating information. Treatment plans are reviewed regularly to assess progress towards treatment goals and objectives, Staff monitor the appropriateness of the individualized Discharge Plan. Multi-disciplinary Treatment Teams, including the client, work together to assist the patient in reaching treatment goals. Specific detoxification service include: medical monitored inpatient detoxification; 24 hour medical supervision from alcohol and other drug intoxication withdrawal; individual counseling and treatment planning; case management; group education, social and life skills activities; referral

services; discharge planning; nutritional screening and ancillary services.

Detoxification Program Mission/Goal:

Outpatient Detoxification services provide medically supervised services for individual dependent on drugs or alcohol, who meet admission criteria and who have been determined as not in need of inpatient medical detoxification. Services provided include admission and addictions assessment, individual psychotherapy, family/support group session, education, relapse prevention and aftercare planning. Breathalyzer and urine drug screen testing are administered once per week randomly. The length of stay for this program ranges between 10 to fourteen days. Individuals undergoing Outpatient Detoxification services may participate may also receive Room and Board Services for those that are homeless or if the living environment is not conducive to recovery.

General Description of Type of Tasks Performed: Help for your drug or alcohol problem.

Treatment will consist of individual and group sessions. Family sessions are available on request. First, you will meet with staff to complete a number of assessments addressing your substance use as well as your mental and physical health. Operation PAR, Inc. prides itself in using techniques that are proven to assist individuals to address their drug and alcohol problems.
